Description of the organization:

The Higher Education Quality Council of Ontario (HEQCO) is an independent agency funded by the Government of Ontario through the Ministry of Training, Colleges and Universities (MTCU). Since it was established in 2006, the Council has been asked by the Ontario government to provide leadership in creating a quality framework for the postsecondary education (PSE) sector; to monitor and report to the government and Ontarians on accessibility to PSE; to encourage inter-institutional transfer, retention and student engagement and success; and to advise on system planning and inter-jurisdictional competitiveness.

We make recommendations on the steps which should be taken to improve the quality of, and accessibility to, PSE programs. We advise the government on targets that should be set to improve PSE and the timeframes for achieving those targets. We also provide the minister with recommendations on performance measures that can be used to evaluate the sector (www.heqco.ca).

Brief description of the nature and scope of research performed by the organization:

The Higher Education Quality Council of Ontario employs a multifaceted research approach with a view to developing meaningful policy recommendations and publishing reports and other publications that inform the PSE community in Ontario, Canada and around the world. The Council conducts its research on the PSE sector under three broad themes:

- Participation/Accessibility/Retention
- Educational Quality
- System Design/Accountability

Our research approach is inclusive, bringing together researchers and practitioners from across the sector through major projects, expert discussion papers, conferences, workshops and colloquia. The Council issues requests for proposals, and enters into contract agreements and partnerships with other research organizations in order to work with some of the best thinkers on issues related to higher education.

Reports are also written by HEQCO research staff as informational pieces on issues of current interest in the PSE sector. They are used to provide context and analysis on a wide range of topics for those in government, academic institutions, associations and individuals with an interest in higher education (www.heqco.ca).
