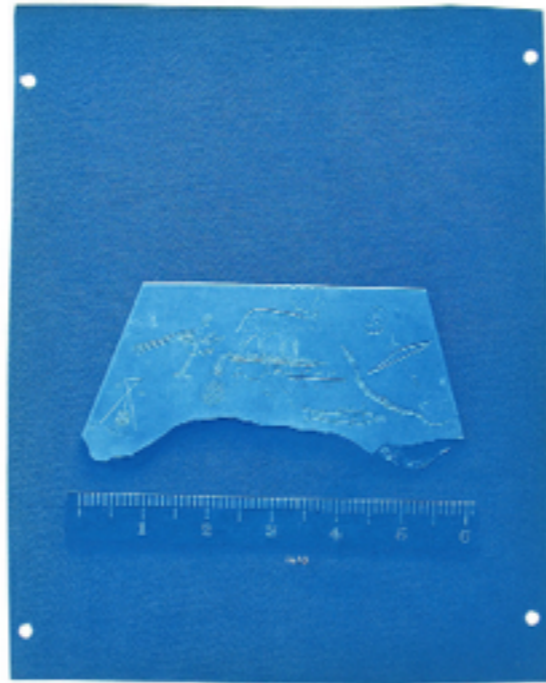
Typical features

- **Objectives and outcomes:** focus on specific skills, competences, knowledge, topics, etc
- **Equivalence:** comparable fixed length, level, accreditation
- **Pacing:** Schedules and timetables
- **Control:** hierarchical management, prerequisites, required modules, etc
- **Process:** integration with institutions, programs, etc
- **Success and failure:** passing and failing

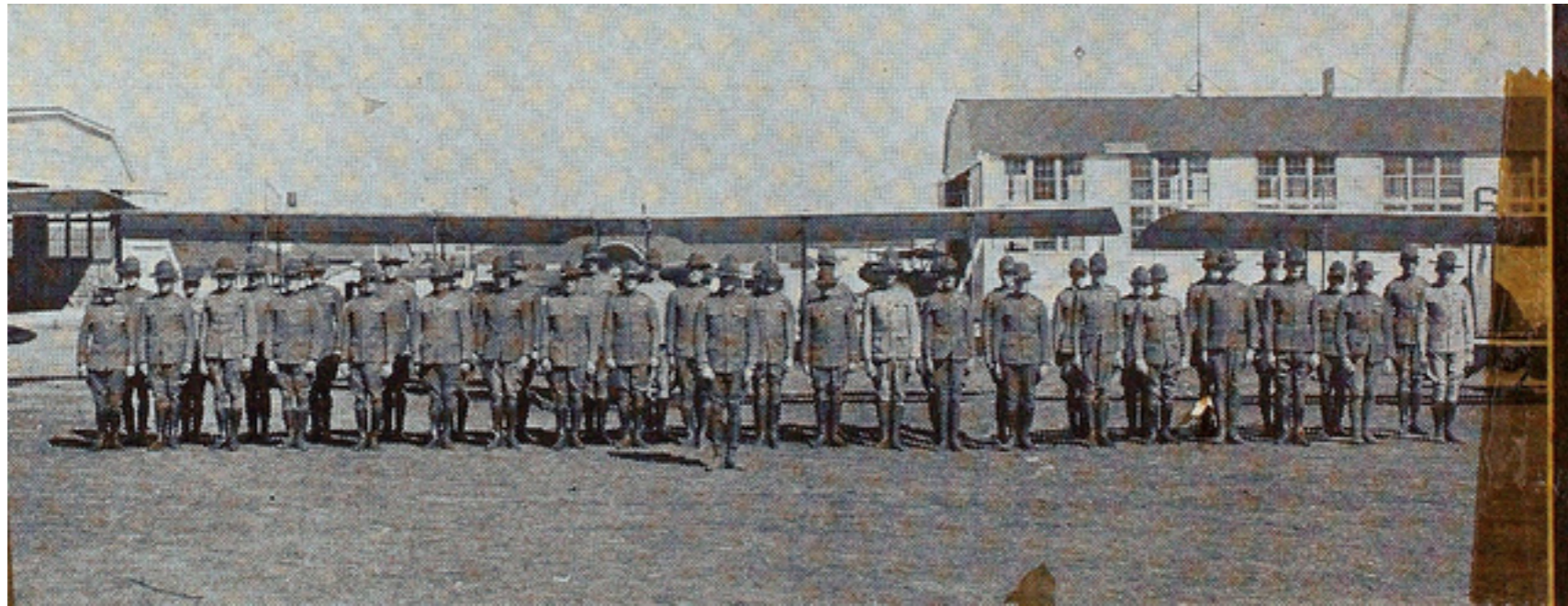

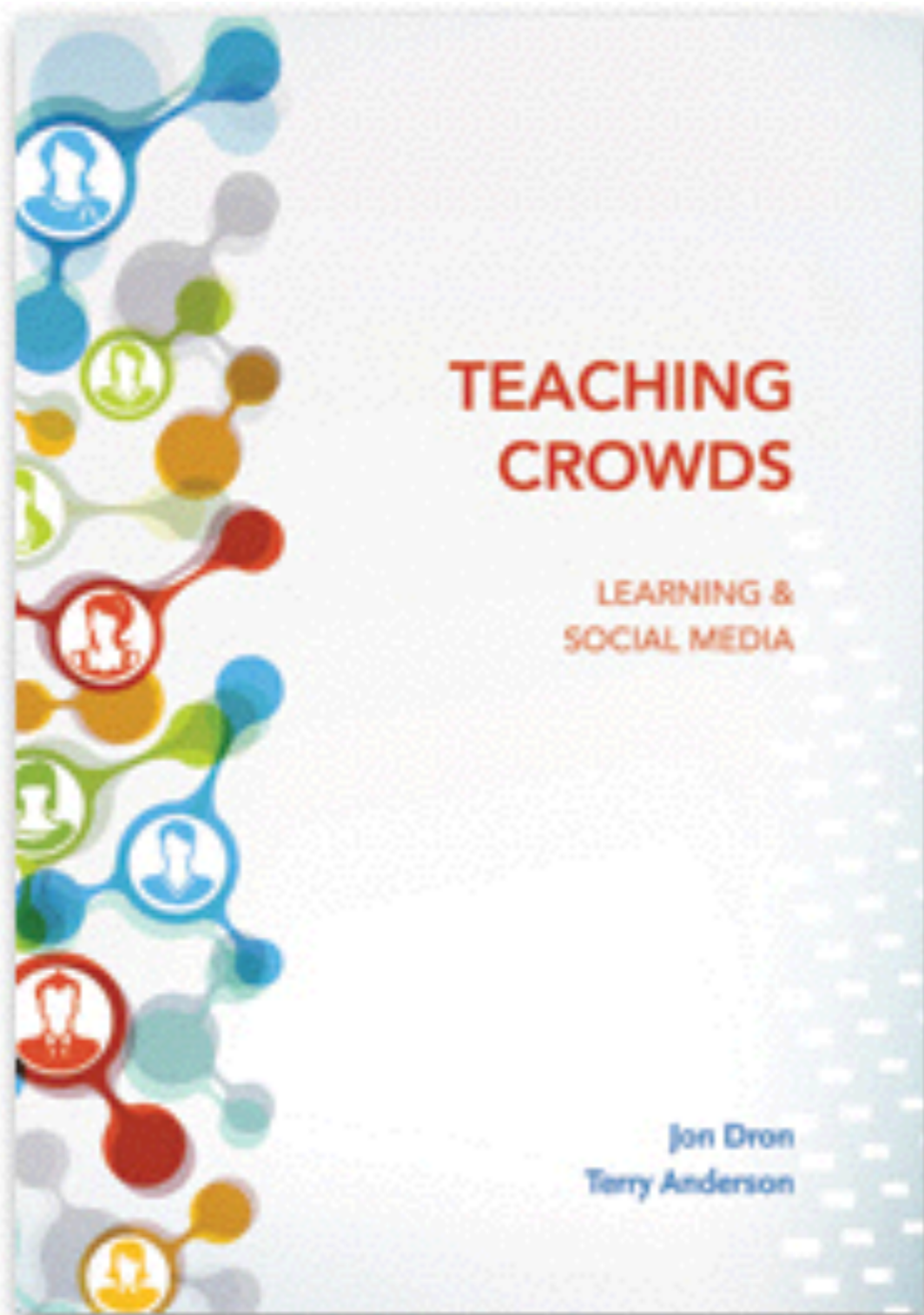

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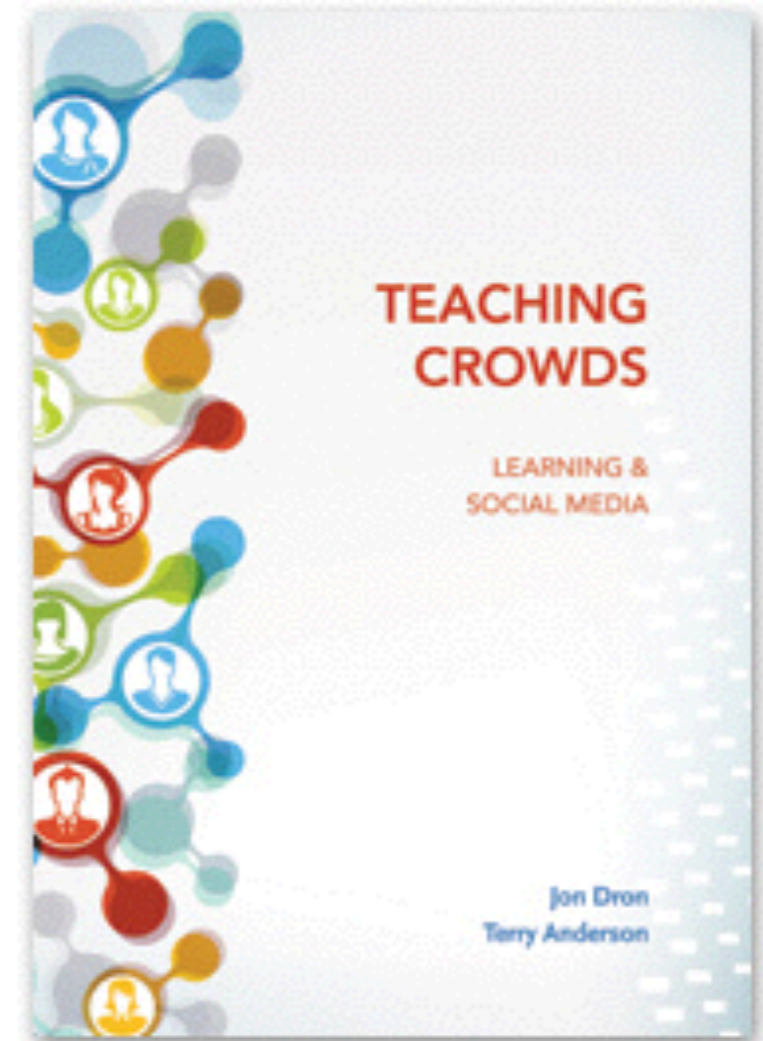
